CRITERIA FOR CHOOSING A SHOW

Introduction: This paper sets out the proposed criteria for selecting a show.

I. Is the proposed show available?

- A. An initial check on whether it is possible to obtain a licence
- B. If a licence is currently available, further investigation can be carried out
- C. If a licence is not available, a note will be made of the reason and a diary note made to re-check in an appropriate number of years, depending on circumstances

II. Has the show been done recently in the local area?

- A. Local area means within approximately 45 minute drive of Horsham
- B. It is important here to only look at comparable sized societies, performing in venues of a similar size to The Capitol and larger

III. Can we cast it?

- A. This means do we have sufficient "talent" available from known resources
- B. Look at regular HAODS performers, including those that "float"
- C. Useful to identify potential "gaps" in cast when putting a show forward

IV. Does it make optimum use of the members of the society?

- A. Need to ensure that over a period of time there is a balance between shows some have greater chorus requirements than others and different splits of male/female principles
- B. Also need to ensure that we offer interest and variety to members that do not appear on stage technical team, wardrobe etc.

V. Can we put together an enthusiastic production team?

- A. This is not just about a Producer/Director
- B. Some shows may require a separate choreographer or other specialist resource
- C. It may be possible to sound out a potential team prior to putting a show forward at least a potential Director & MD

VI. Is it box office?

A. Again, balance is important - we need to contrast popular, higher earning shows with those that continue to provide variety for the members and our supporters

VII. Does it provide the society with a challenge?

- A. Making optimum use of members and providing variety for members/supporters are important
- B. The over-riding principle must be that the shows offered fit with the HAODS Constitution & Rules

VIII. Budget/Business Plan

- A. Need to put together an outline budget and business plan for each show offered
- B. This will necessarily be fairly high level, but should draw on box office experience wherever possible when recommending shows that we have done before
- C. The budget should be supported by a set of key assumptions and recommendations for further analysis should a show be selected
